

D-STAR

There are several new repeaters in the Southland that are linked together through the International network of D-STAR repeaters. The two newest repeaters are run by the Papa Repeater System and are located on Oat Mountain near Los Angeles on 447.200 –, "KI6JKA B", and Saddle Peak near Malibu on 449.080 –, "KF6BQK B". Repeaters

Brian & I took care of some Echolink upgrades recently. The San Clemente site has been reconfigured so that the CTCSS tone is present on the repeater output ONLY when the user radio is keyed. Then the hang time and courtesy tone have been restored. With these changes, the Echolink node, which uses CTCSS squelch, will not transmit the courtesy tone over internet (which is an Echolink requirement for participating in conferences). Users also will not hear the courtesy tone if they are using CTCSS squelch, otherwise they will.

The other change we made was to upgrade the Echolink software to the latest version. For current features and functions see the Echolink.org site. As part of the software upgrade we also upgraded the Echo-Time function. Currently you will hear 'Kate' but from time to time I may change it to 'Paul' or 'Sam'! We are also aware that the audio on the Trabuco Canyon site is quite low. We suspect a component failure and will repair it as soon as site access and time permits. KG6GI

The seminar program got off to a great start with the antenna presentation by Ron Weaver, W6OM. Two seminars are now scheduled and more are planned for next year. Part two of the **antenna seminar** is scheduled for November 1, 2007. A seminar on "**How to use the Echolink Repeater**" is set for November 15th The presenter is Howard Brown, KG6GI. Starting time for each seminar is 7:00PM and they will run for two hours. They will be held at the Murray Senior Center. The room number will be announced.

I have approached Brian, NJ6N, to conduct a **D-STAR seminar** early next year. This is intended to be a 'hands-on' seminar where each of the attendees will be shown how to use the D-Star system. I have been formulating plans to bring my test equipment from home to the Murray Center to conduct a two night **measurement seminar**. I have an oscilloscope, signal generator, digital and analog meters, and power supplies.
