HamCon 2007 Wrap-up

On Saturday, January 12, I attended the wrap up meeting of the Hamcon '07 Organizing Committee. As you probably know. Hamcon is the annual ARRL Southwest Division Convention that rotates around the division. It is held in the LA / OC area every four years. SOARA was one of the 14 organizing / sponsoring clubs for the '07 convention that was held in Torrance last August. At the meeting we learned that the convention made almost \$15,000, and after leaving Approximately \$3,000.00 in the Hamcon account for the 2011 convention, each of the 14 clubs received a check for \$1,000.00. \$200.00 was a refund of the seed money each club put up front, and \$800.00 was our share of the profit!

It should be noted that during the other years, the convention rotates around the SW Division, with future venues in Phoenix in 2008, Inland Empire 2009, San Diego in 2010, and back to the LA / OC area for 2011. Frequently the other venues barely break even, or make very little. SOARA has been involved as a sponsoring club twice, first in Long Beach in 2003, and Torrance in 2007. Both times we have been fortu-

nate enough as a Convention Committee to do very well.

SOARA's major contributions to the '07 convention were presenting the traditional Wouff Hong Pageant and Ceremony, and sponsoring / presenting two of the Technical Sessions, both involving D-Star digital communications. I want to thank the many SOARA members who put in long hours ahead of time, preparing, rehearsing, obtaining materials, as well as actually presenting the programs at the convention. In addition, SOARA maintained an informational booth at the exhibition.
