


As the date for Field Day draws closer you can expect to hear more of the details of the event. Planning started early this year, and we can expect that to pay off in increased efficiency and fun for the participants. There will be something to enable everyone to be involved. The key leadership roles have been identified, and volunteers will be welcomed for a wide variety of jobs.

Early on Saturday morning, June 27, work will start on setting up the operating positions and antennas. Lots of hands are needed to assemble and erect the array of antennas. At 11:00 AM (local time) we will start making contacts. Operators for CW, Phone and PSK will be operating the three main HF stations with the aid of loggers to enter the contact information into the computer. One VHF station and the GOTA (Get On The Air) station give us contact points without changing our status (3A) of having three (HF) active transmitters. The "A" in the "3A" status indicates that it is a club entry.

We will have a public information table and several demonstration activities to show the public the broad range of Amateur Radio capabilities. Oh, there will be food and fellowship. If you don't do anything else, come by the site (Gilleran Park in Mission Viejo) and enjoy some radio and friends.
