## Raffle

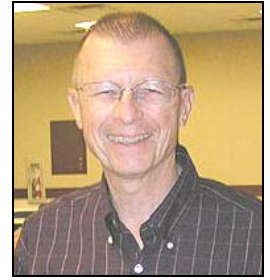

## Next Month

The program for April will deal with the Hospital Disaster Support Communications System (HDSCS). SOARA member, John Walker, AC7GK, a Certified Hospital Communicator with HDSCS will make the presentation. He has been active in emergency communications for most of his 20+ years as a ham. John has a background as an educator. This is a presentation that you won't want to miss.



## Education

The measurement class was concluded on March 3, 2010. We were able to make measurements on a three stage general purpose amplifier. I took measurements before the class and then re-ran the data with the class. I plotted the data on an Excel spread sheet. Excel has the ability to plot data using a log display on the X axis.

During an earlier class, we measured the frequency and amplitude of the signals in my Hybrid HW32A.

There have also been some inquiries by the class about starting a QRP program. ARRL has a relatively new QRP book on the market. I want to pick up a copy and look at the circuits that are in the book. I have also been in touch with International Crystal for prices and delivery of crystals for a simple QRP CW transmitter. Crystals for frequencies above 4.0 MHz are about \$21 plus shipping. Below 4.0 MHz, the price jumps to above \$50.00 I have also found that Universal Radio has Amidon Toroids for sale at \$1.00 a piece. .

# Pre-Field Day Drill on April 3, 2010

## Field Day

*Always the fourth full weekend in June*

One of the secrets of a successful Field Day is being prepared. On Saturday, April 3, SOARA is going to have a day of preparation at our usual Field Day site: Gilleran Park in Mission Viejo. The activities will start at 9:00 AM and will continue through the day. We plan to stay no later than 6:00PM. Set aside that day on your calendar and plan on spending a part of the day with us.

The antennas that we will be using in June will be assembled and tested. Missing or damaged hardware will be replaced, all electrical connections will be checked for corrosion, etc. An antenna analyzer will be used to check the SWR on each antenna and the antenna will be tuned if necessary. If you are proficient at antenna work we can use your help. If not,

then come out and see how it is done.

The radios that we plan on using will also be tested to ensure that we do not find troubles during the actual Field Day operation in June. There will be opportunities to operate the radios for members who would like to brush up on operating techniques. In June we want to keep all of our stations busy for the entire contest period. This means an operator and a logger for each. There will be lots of opportunity for participation.



In an actual disaster we might have to set up an operation where there is no commercial power and no existing antennas. Field Day and this preliminary drill may well pay off in our being able to function when communications is needed. Oh, yes, if you are not convinced yet, lunch will be provided.



If I find the T first I will show them what a "hidden" T is.

Mark, KD6WLY, was the first to locate the hidden transmitter in the February hunt, so he had the pleasure of hiding the transmitter (the T) for the hunt on Sunday, March 7. In February, Richard, K6RBS, hid the transmitter and hid in the brush to take photographs of the hunters as they closed in on the transmitter. (The picture of Mark above was from that hunt.)

Mark has a shop in Portola Hills — in an industrial section. But there is a nice little public park tucked away just across a creek from his shop. And along the edge of the park is strip of wilderness area. What a nice place to hide a transmitter. And hide it he did; the antenna was tucked well out of sight in a crack in a wooden fence post. Coax ran from the antenna,

about 12 feet to the transmitter, which was buried under a thick layer of dried brush. (where did he get GREEN coax?)

Richard, K6RBS, and Spencer, KI6URT, were the first to arrive at the general area and set out on foot. Shortly afterward Karl, KF6MDF, and Dale, W8RRV, arrived and entered the park. Soon all four were examining the wilderness area in detail. Karl was the first to spot the transmitter in the brush. Soon all had found it and set off for a local coffee shop where Mark and Laura, K6VIX, were relaxing — and observing the action on a laptop computer. He had set up a webcam on the roof of his shop..

The next scheduled hunt will be held on Sunday, April 4. The hunt will start at 1:00 PM. Coordination will be through SOARA's 147.180 MHz repeater.
