Wildfires are more likely to occur and spread during Red Flag conditions, when strong winds are accompanied by low humidity levels and high temperatures. OC Fire Watch will increase public awareness of the fire dangers by raising red "Fire Alert" flags at OC Parks and other County facilities, as well as at Orange County Fire Authority fire stations and participating City Halls throughout Orange County.

The program will also incorporate fire watch volunteers to help monitor the County's wilderness parks, which are especially vulnerable to fire during Red Flag conditions. OC Parks and OCFA will raise Fire Alert flags at their respective facilities during designated Red Flag conditions which will be based on CALFIRE advisories.

Android App

MWave-design.nl reports that it has introduced the first Android application that allows users to do RF and microwave calculations and conversions. The target users are engineers, electronics students, and radio amateurs. The current version (V1.0) contains 35 calculators, with more tools planned for the future

Current calculators include: PI and T attenuator, VSWR, mismatch error limits. mitered bend. ratio-to-dB. field intensity and power density, parallel LCR impedance, series LCR impedance, inductor impedance, capacitance impedance, Ohm's Law, radio equation (1-way path loss), air core Inductor inductance, parallel-plate capacitor, noise floor, amplifier cascade (NF, Gain, P1db, IP2, IP3), skin depth, low-pass filter, high-pass filter, band-pass filter, band-stop filter, image rejection, frequency band designations, EMC (EIRP, ERP, dBµV/m), helical antenna, Peak to RMS, mixer spurious.
