Ham Radio Featured on an ABC Network TV Show

On Friday evening, March 15, the ABC network aired an episode of the comedy series "Last Man Standing" starring Tim Allen (Home Improvement) as Mike Baxter, marketing Director of "The Outdoor Man," a large sporting goods store. In this episode, Tim's boss, Ed Alzate, travels on a safari to the wilds of Brazil, and utilizes Amateur Radio to make contact on 20 meters with Kyle, back at the store in the U.S.

One of Mike's three daughters, Mandy, is receiving poor grades in history, so Mike takes away all her modern electronic communications devices; cellphone, laptop, ,etc. Mandy is devastated because she can no longer keep up her contacts with friends via all social networking, etc. She especially wants to talk with Kyle, her current love interest. As Mandy is searching the garage to see if she can find where her Dad has hidden her cellphone, she hears Ed in Brazil and Kyle at the store, in QSO Excitedly, she keys up her Dad's HF radio and talks with Kyle.

The show is fairly true to the ham hobby, with Mike's home shack located in the garage, featuring an Icom 7000, boom mike, and lots of QSL cards and award certificates on the wall. Mike, Kyle, and Ed all are licensed hams with call signs. The Show departs with authenticity, when, presumably unlicensed Mandy uses her Dad's station to join the QSO, and neither Ed nor Kyle admonish her. The scene ends with Kyle explaining Ham radio, and the fun of the hobby to Mandy, and she observes that "Ham radio is just like Twitter, only more advanced, because you don't have to type!"

It seems that the show's writers had some knowledgeable technical advisors because overall, the ham radio segment was very positive, and a relatively accurate representation of ham radio. I would consider the show as a very positive "pitch" for our hobby.
