From the VP

The real Definition of Amateur Radio is that it is not a hobby but a public service. Having said that, most of us think of the fun that we have practicing our "hobby" and only occasionally think what we can do when the chips are down. Emergency communications consist of two major branches: the first is local communications - city, county, and area wide; and the second is nationwide or global. For local communications we have radio systems, including repeater stations with back up power, that California will cover Southern more. For longer distances we use the high frequency bands between 80 meters and 10 meters with batteries and other back up systems. This range of frequencies is used to support global emergencies such as earthquakes, hurricanes and other

major catastrophes. Most forms of communication, including the internet, cell phones and even home phones stop working the moment the power grid goes down. We as amateur radio operators like to be able to say that we can communicate without external power. We have big batteries, generators, and will even use our vehicles to power our radios to make sure that they will work in a pinch. The attack of 911 and the emergence of Homeland Security has proven to be a real boon to amateur radio. Hams are being used to support their efforts for emergency communications. Also, several religious organizations - notably The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints - have really worked hard to encourage their members to become hams and they have done it from the top down with reasonable success.

Propagation de K7RA

Average daily sunspot numbers increased slightly this week from 111.4 to 113.3, but average daily solar flux declined by 22 points from 155.4 to 133.4. Although there seems to be no shortage of sunspots, they are anemic and not magnetically complex, and thus radiation from the spots is feeble, indicated by lower solar flux values.

Predicted solar flux for the near term is 135 on January 24, 130 on January 25-26, 135 on January 27, 140 on January 28-30, 150 on January 31, 155 on February 1-5, 160 on February 6 -7, then 150, 140 and 135 on February 8-10, 125 on February 11-15, and 130 on February 16-20.

Predicted planetary A index is 5 on January 24-26, 8 on January 27, 12 on January 28, 5 on January 29 through February 7-8, 5 on February 7-8, 5 on February 17 and 5 on February 18-23.


2014 Yuma Hamfest (Feb 14-15th)




High Desert Trails Rally

T-Hunt News


