Earthquake Preparedness

The March 28, 2014 [La Habra] earthquake was a good reminder to be prepared for any disaster.

We do have a great article with suggestions for your modular "go kits" and this can be found on the SOARA website <u>here</u>. (Republished with permission.)

Also, please remember that after a quake to make way for use of the repeaters/ simplex for any emergency and damage traffic first. Use should be short and allow plenty of room between communications for breaks. Use of cell phones should be lim-

ited immediately following a quake, use SMS text messaging to check on loved ones instead of calling.

BEGINNER HAM RADIO CLASS

- Live equipment demonstrations, including emergency communications.
- Training on how to operate through local radio repeater systems.
- Radio demonstrations of radio internet linking, and computer communications.
- Multiple choice examinations with no Morse code test required.

Ham radio operators provide valuable communications in an emergency. Many cities throughout the country use ham radio operators to support Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training and actual call-outs. This four-session class will feature live ham radio equipment for everyone to learn how to operate. With homework between sessions, spend a few weeks learning to pass your amateur radio Element 2 Technician Class examination, and pass your Technician test given the Saturday following the last session at Amateur Radio Field Day.
