### The K7RA Solar Update

On October 15 at 2345 UTC, the Australian Space Forecast Centre issued a geomagnetic disturbance warning, which said that continued strengthening of the solar wind stream due to coronal hole effect may lead to isolated periods of minor geomagnetic storms on October 16.

Sunspot numbers during the October 8-14 reporting period were nearly the same as during the previous 7 days. Average daily sunspot numbers went from 37 to 36.9, and average daily solar flux dropped from 93.8 to 87.5. As in previous solar cycles, geomagnetic indicators are high as the cycle trends downward after the peak.

Go to the bottom of [WM7D's Solar Resource Page](#) and note the graph for Ap (planetary A index) progression. If you look at the graph just above that for solar flux, see how the Ap index is high after the peak of solar flux or sunspot numbers.

K6UVR, and Ray AE6h. We demonstrated UHF, VHF and HF operations to the public, as well as go bags, and portable operations. Thanks to all of you who helped set up, take down and staff the booth. Also thanks to the several SOARA members who took the time to stop by and chat.

Finally, on a slightly less positive note: Several times in the last few weeks, members have accidentally transmitted for extended times on out repeaters. In one recent instance, 447.180 was tied up with a strong continuous carrier for over 3 hours! As I said, these incidents are purely unintentional, and accidental, but they do point out a couple of very important considerations we all should make as good operators, and being observant of good amateur practice.

First, very simply, nearly all if not all modern radios have Time Out Timers, sometimes seen as "TOT" or similar nomenclature in the settings menus. This feature exists for two important reasons: First, to protect your radio from overheating and destruction of the transmitting final amplifier(s). Second, and equally important is to prevent unwanted extended transmissions that tie up repeaters, and also that are illegal as they do not comply with the ten minute identifying requirement of Part 97 of the FCC Rules and Regulations for Amateur Radio. Another cause of annoying extended transmissions is the practice of failing to mount and use the microphone hang up clips that come with virtually every mobile or base radio. Similarly mobile microphones or handheld radios can be carelessly placed in vehicle cup holders, seats, or other places where the PTT is accidentally activated. All these occurrences can be avoided simply by adhering to good amateur practice: Use the equipment and features provided with your radio, coupled with good common sense. Our local FCC OO (Official Observer) recommends time out timers be set to one minute, or one and one half minutes tops. This really is plenty of time to say what you need to, especially on uhf or vhf. If you can't finish, then resume with another transmission after catching your breath. Don't become a repeater hog by accidentally tying up a machine when it can be easily prevented.

## T-Hunt News

The next [Homing In] Southern California on-foot transmitter hunting session will be Saturday, October 24, 2015 at El Dorado Park in Long Beach. If you are a beginner, there will be entry-level two-meter fox transmitters, set by Joe Moell K0OV. Once you're proficient at finding these nearby foxes, try the 5-fox two-meter international-rules course, set by Marvin Johnston KE6HTS. One or two optional 80-meter fox transmitters may also be on the air.

A ham radio license and knowledge of radio equipment are not required. Experts will be on hand to teach you the basic techniques of on-foot radio direction-finding (RDF). Bring the kids and grandkids, then go out on the course with them! All ages are welcome, but young children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

If you have receivers, scanners, directional antennas, attenuators, or other equipment suitable for on-foot RDF, be sure to bring it. Make sure all batteries are fresh. A limited amount of RDF gear will be available for loan.

For those who want to build RDF gear for use with their own two-meter hand-held radios or scanners, Marvin will have kits for measuring-tape yagis and active attenuators. There will be tools and soldering stations for building. If you're not an electronic technician, don't worry because there will be experts to help you. Send e-mail to Marvin ([marvin@west.net](mailto:marvin@west.net)) to pre-register and get more information about equipment. The building session will only take place if there are sufficient advance registrations. If you already have equipment and just want to hunt transmitters, you don't need to pre-register.

If it takes place, the building session will start at 9:30 AM. Please be prompt. Beginner transmitters will be on the air at that time. The main 5-fox hunt will start about 10:30 AM. Hunters may start the courses at any time until 1 PM. Courses close at 3 PM.

For the advanced 2-meter course, electronic scoring will be used. If you have an "e-stick," be sure to bring it. A \$5 donation is requested for the advanced course to cover expenses related to the use of Los Angeles Orienteering Club's e-punch equipment and maps. The beginner course and the 80-meter transmitter hunt are free of charge and e-punch is not required for them.

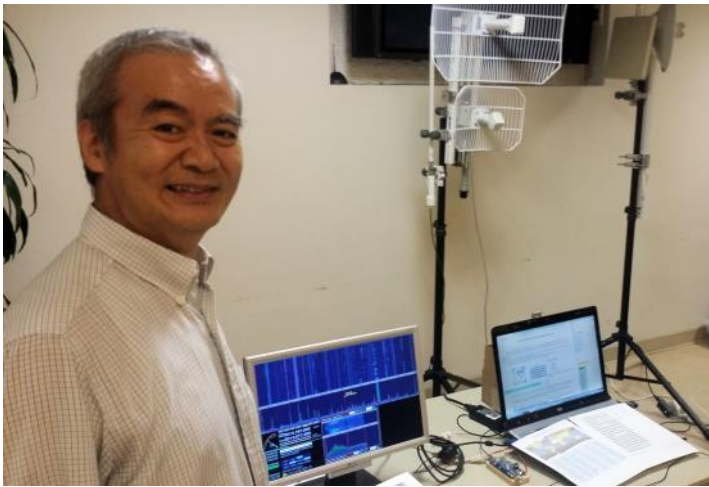
El Dorado Regional Park East in Long Beach, California is bounded on the west by the San Gabriel River and on the east by the 605 Freeway. From the 605 Freeway, take the Spring Street and Cerritos Avenue exit, go west on Spring about 0.2 miles and turn right (north) at the traffic signal into the park entrance. (There are park entrances on both the north and south sides of the road. Talk-in is on Raytheon Employees repeater K6QEH/R, 146.97(-) PL 136.5.
