SOARA's WW7D Award

Many of you have no doubt heard of the SOARA, Richard Coyne WW7D award, but may not know the story behind it. Here's a quick history and an explanation of the purpose of the award.

Annually, beginning in 2005, SOARA has presented the WW7D Award at the Holiday banquet. The award consists of a certificate, and an obelisk with clock, bearing the names of all recipients, and the year they received the award. The purpose of the award is to recognize the SOARA member who, over the previous year, has made outstanding contributions, to the club, and to the Amateur radio hobby and community. Our first honoree, in 2005, was Lou Frank KG6FCT, and last year's 2015 recipient was Hal Silverman, WB6WXO.



The WW7D award, derives it's name from, was created to honor longtime SOARA member, Richard Coyne, WW7D who passed away unexpectedly on May 28, 2002. Richard would have been a worthy recipient of his own award, for he gave freely of his time and effort both to amateur radio,

The K7RA Solar Update 10/14/16

Solar flux and sunspot numbers rose over the past week, while geomagnetic indicators were down.

Average daily sunspot numbers for October 6-12 rose 34.3 points to 55, and average daily solar flux rose 15.2 points to 101.9, referenced to the previous seven days.

Average planetary A index declined from 21.4 to 6.6, and midlatitude A index from 15.1 to 5.

Predicted solar flux is 95 on October 14, 90 on October 15-21, 85 on October 22 -26, 80 on October 27-29, 90 and 95 on October 30-31, 100 on November 1-2, 105 on November 3-7, 110 on November 8-9, 105 and 100 on November 10-11, 95 on November 12-14. 90 on November 15-17, and 85 on November 18-22



Interference on the Repeaters

Our private high level 440 repeater has been experiencing several instances of extended interference lately. Interference may be intentional, or unintentional. It is often hard to tell which it is. We've all heard unintentional transmissions made by someone who has keyed their transmitter by leaning against the radio's PTT button on the car seat, or by a handie-talkie pressing up against something (e.g. in a backpack). For this reason, we recommend that you set your radio's "time out timer" (TOT) to at most, 3 minutes. This way your radio will stop transmitting after the timer has been reached and possibly even beep to let you know that you were transmitting.

If you are hearing someone playing music, tones, or otherwise transmitting "noise" through any of the SOARA machines, please do not respond or otherwise engage the person in a conversation. Instead, switch to the INPUT of the repeater (usually by pressing the REV or MON key on your radio) and record the signal strength, your current location, and any other details that might be be useful including signal description, was it constant in strength, what type of antenna you were using, the bearing if you have a beam antenna, etc. Send your report to qrm@soara.org

The information collected from reports like this will help us track down and stop whomever is transmitting the unwanted noise through our repeaters. We have been very successful in tracking down and stopping interference with the expert assistance of our avid Transmitter Hunters.

Reminder:

Support Passage of the Amateur Radio Parity Act!

On September 12, 2016, the US House of Representatives, passed H.R. 1301, a bill known as the Amateur Radio Parity Act. While there has been quite a bit of publicity about this bill in the Ham world, still I run into those who aren't familiar with this important bill or the provisions in it. In a nutshell, this bill extends FCC ruling, PRB-1 to deed-restricted communities with Home Owner's Associations. Those deed restrictions are typically known here in California as Conditions, Covenants, and Restrictions, or CC&R's. Unfortunately, a large number of us live in areas that are bound by those CC&R's, and are applied to us as a contractual agreement we signed, often unknowingly, when we purchased our homes.

Fortunately, there is a move, heavily supported by the ARRL, and others to invalidate CCR's where they apply to reasonable amateur radio antennas. Those efforts have

brought us to where we are today, on the cusp of having those deed restrictions removed by H.R. 1301. As I indicated above, this bill to remove the antenna restrictions just passed the U.S. House of Representatives, and is now awaiting action by the U.S. Senate.

We encourage each of you to contact your California U.S. Senators, Barbara Boxer, and Dianne Feinstein (or the Senators in your state).
