

This month's \$5 raffle prize is an <u>lcom ID-31A UHF Digital</u> Transceiver.

The ID-31A has a look and feel along with a new user interface packed into slim, compact chassis protected with IPX7 submersible construction.

The built-in GPS receiver shows your current position and altitude for GPS position reporting function and the GPS log

function tracks your movement. The ID-31A has a micro SD card slot which can be used for storing GPS log, voice memory and memory contents.

The large full dot-matrix display, directional keypad and quick menu button also ease the usability. Accessing a D-STAR (Digital Smart Technology for Amateur Radio) repeater has been made even easier.

The K7RA Solar Update

Sunspot numbers and solar flux declined over the past week relative to the previous seven days. Average daily sunspot number went from 86.6 to 56.7, while average daily solar flux slid from 117.4 to 107.8. Geomagnetic indices were up. Average daily planetary A index went from 9.4 to 17.7, and mid-latitude A index went from 7.4 to 12.6.

Early in this week Spaceweather.co m was anticipating a CME, but instead we got a stiff solar wind, causing the planetary A index to rise to 38 on February 16 and 34 on February 17. This will most likely subside.

Predicted planetary A index is 20, 12 and 8 on February 19-21, 5 on February 22-29, then 15, 10, 12 and 8 on March 1-4, then 5, 15, 10 and 8 on March 5-8, then 5 on March 9-10, then 8, 5, 27 and 12 on March 11-14, and 20, 12, 10 and 8 on March 15-18, and 5 on March 19-27.

Predicted solar flux is 95 on February 19-20, 100 on February 21-23, 105 on February 24-25, 110 on February 26, 115 on February 27-28, 118 on February 29, 120 on March 4-5, 110 on March 6-7, 105 on March 8-12, 108 on March 13-14, then 105, 103, 106, 107 and 110 on March 15-19, and 115 on March 20-26.

Repeater User's Guide & Membership Manual

I still have plenty of manuals. This manual has a wealth of information for easy reference.

HamShield & 3D Printing

The Kickstarter for HamShield has been sending regular updates. It looks like the Arduino HamShield board will ship soon. It's about four months late and that's fine with me. Casey and team have been fixing various issues. Better them than me. Plus, I'm not sure some of the issues they found are easy to fix without re-laying out the board. Once the shield arrives, I expect to get it running and then start developing a 3D printed case with a battery and a touch screen. I'm hoping the Arduino 101 is compatible. If it isn't, I may make an 3.3 V adapter board. The Arduino 101 is an amazing board for \$30. I just ordered some conductive 3d print filament. Once I have a fairly stable case design, I want to see if a conductive plastic case makes any improvement. Otherwise, I might print a glow-in-the-dark case. Hehe...

MFJ / CrushCraft R9 Antenna Install

This antenna has mixed reviews. I took my time assembling the kit over several days. I used zinc compound on all the aluminum joints. The only issue during assembly was drilling out a hole in a plastic support bracket. The drill press came in handy. I managed to tune the R9 for 40 meters and below with reasonable SWR. I used an RigExpert AA-600 antenna analyzer. I still need to tweak the antenna for 80 meters. If I optimized SWR for 80 meters then 40 meters suffered. So far, it seems I have to compromise 40 and 80 meters. But, this may be something I missed. Since the R9 works reasonably well, the to-do has been deferred for later. Jim KI6LOM helped me put the antenna up. This install was more work than expected. I did guy the antenna per the recommendation. With the high winds lately, I'm really glad I did.

SKYWARN® Training March 4

The effects of severe weather are felt every year by many Americans. To obtain critical weather information, NOAA's National Weather Service (NWS), part of the U.S. Department of Commerce, established SKYWARN® with partner organizations. SKYWARN® is a volunteer program with nearly 290,000 trained severe weather spotters. These volunteers help keep their local communities safe by providing timely and accurate reports of severe weather to the National Weather Service.



Although SKYWARN® spotters provide essential information for all types of weather hazards, the main responsibility of a SKYWARN® spotter is to identify and describe severe local storms. In the average year, 10,000 severe thunderstorms, 5,000 floods and more than 1,000 tornadoes occur across the United States. These events threatened lives and property.

Anaheim Fire & Rescue's Emergency Management & Preparedness Section along with Anaheim Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services (RACES) will be hosting a SKYWARN® training session.

Training is free and typically lasts about 2 hours. You'll learn:

- Basics of thunderstorm development
- · Fundamentals of storm structure
- Identifying potential severe weather features
- Information to report
- How to report information
- · Basic severe weather safety

Who is Eligible?

NWS encourages anyone with an interest in public service and access to communication, such HAM radio, to join the SKYWARN® program.
