President's Message, August 2018

This month's message is a bit shorter than usual. I do want to comment on three things, however.

First I want to give a hearty thanks to Dana, KM6LZG, and of course to hubby Erik, W6INE for the great job they both did in planning, organizing, and presenting a great summer picnic. For those of you who missed it, the lake setting was great, there was swimming for those so inclined, as well as boat cruises on the lake, great food, and good company. It was a very successful picnic, from all I've heard. Thanks too, to all others who pitched in to bring goodies and deserts and make it another great picnic.

Next, we need to thank the firefighters of the US Forest Service, Cal Fire, and the OC Fire Authority for their excellent work on the Holy Fire. For those of you may not be aware, we came perilously close to losing much or all of the Santiago Peak Com Site, where our 447.180 and 224.640 repeaters are located. Actually, Santiago Peak is a very critical comm. site for Southern California, with not only are a number of Amateur facilities located there, but is used extensively but nearly every agency, federal, state, and local, along with many commercial service providers. There are literally hundreds of transmitters located there, and the fire came right up to the edge of the facilities, but they very aggressively successfully defended the site.

Finally, on a sadder note, it appears that the WWV and WWVH radio beacons are on the chopping block, victims of federal budget cuts to the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST). In addition to providing accurate time standards to many services, these Transmitters are great propagation beacons as well. The NIST FY 2019 budget cuts amount to \$49 million, and shutting down the beacons will save approximately \$6.3 million. If you are concerned about this potential shutdown, a call or email to your congressman might be in order.
