President's Message, September 2018

Disaster Season 2018 is Here

We are entering 2018 the fall disaster season here in the US and around the world. Fire Season is picking up, and although some fire experts argue that fire season is now year 'round, traditionally we have Southern CA Santa Ana wind events, September through December making these months our more vulnerable times. Also, we're starting to see what now portends to be a very active Hurricane, and tropical cyclone year as well. Ocean temperatures off our Southern CA coast are also elevated, and this could lead us into a strong El Nino year, with heavy rains, and accompanying land slides and debris flows from the fire areas.

All these combined factors should urge us as amateur radio operators to be sure to check out the readiness of our stations, portable radios, auxiliary power supplies, batteries, etc. Whether you belong to a disaster preparedness radio group such as ARES, RACES, SKYWARN, CERT, OC Fire Watch, or the like, or just want to be able to help your family and neighborhood in times of a communications emergency, we all need to keep our resources in good order. If you don't currently belong to one of the above or similar organizations or groups, you might consider volunteering for one, and make good use of all that investment we have all made in radio gear.

Aside from our radios, this disaster season is also a good reminder to check and renew our household emergency supplies of non perishable food, water, first aid, flashlights, etc. Maybe a good time to make sure you have a few extra canisters of fuel for our camping stoves too. The list of good things to have on hand goes on, and there are several good guides for what items you should have on hand, so I won't give an exhaustive list here.

Finally, I'd like to remind those of you, especially those who are relatively new to HF operations, that in the times of disaster, the FCC will declare certain amateur frequencies that are temporarily reserved

for emergency operations by hams within and assisting with the disaster recovery operations. We will attempt to forward, via email, those FCC reserved frequencies as soon as we get notified of them. Frequently check the ARRL website during disasters for announcement of these emergency frequencies and nets to avoid transmitting on. They do offer some interesting listening only opportunities, however. Please do not transmit, even to offer assistance, unless you are directly involved in the disaster ops, and/or are absolutely certain you can render significant assistance.

Typically, the National Hurricane Watch Net (HWN) operates on 14.325 MHz daytime, and 7.268 MHz at night. Other frequencies may also be declared for these disaster nets. The Salvation Army Emergency Radio Network (SATERN) is usually found on 14.265, with 14.312 as an alternate. The additional FCC reserved disaster frequencies as well as a wealth of other related information can be found at www.arrl.org/2018-Hurricanes. Check this site frequently and before you operate HF during a known hurricane, tropical storm, or other disaster event.

Let's hope that the somewhat dire predictions for a serious disaster season are overly pessimistic, but we should always keep our situational awareness and equipment status in a high state of readiness.

SOARA Temple Hill Repeater - Now With Echolink

Echolink (al la svxLink) is now available on the 147.645 Temple Hill repeater!

You may have heard the new Echolink node in action on the Temple Hill 2m machine. The system was built using a Raspberry Pi 3 model "B" single board computer, high endurance micro SD card, and USB audio dongle. The system runs a variant of the Debian Linux operating system for Raspberry Pi called "raspbian". The echolink application software is called "svxLink" and was written by Tobias Blomberg, SM0SVX. This sophisticated software is capable of providing full repeater control along with repeater to repeater linking and echolink support. The hardware is interfaced to the RLC-3 8-port repeater controller and appears as another repeater transmitter & receiver.

The call sign for the node is "K6SOA-L". The "-L" designation is normally reserved for "links" and "-R" designation for repeaters. However, K6SOA-R is already in use on the San Clemente 146.025 machine. To remember which is which, you can think of the "-L" as "Laguna".

To use the system from your smart phone, tablet, or computer, search for "K6SOA-L" or node # 177360 from your favorite Echolink client application. From the repeater side, sending a single asterisk (*) will cause svxLink to respond with its status, along with Orange County weather.

To connect the repeater to an EchoLink node, use your DTMF keypad to send the command to invoke Echolink (2), followed by the pound key (#), followed by the node number, and another pound sign. For example, sending: "2#133376#" would connect the Laguna Repeater to Node 133376 which is our Echolink node number on our San Clemente machine. The system will respond with "Activating Echolink, connecting to Kilo Six Sierra Oscar Alpha Repeater... Connected" To disconnect, send a single pound sign (#). Note: the pound key (#) is like the "return" or "enter" key on your computer.

If you want to hear how you sound on the repeater, you can invoke "Parrot" mode by sending "1#". Once activated, anything heard will be echoed back by svxLink. To exit this mode, send a single pound key (#).

SOARA Q3 Statement of Revenue and Expenses

The following is SOARA's Q3 Statement of Revenue and Expenses, for the period ending June 2018. Our fiscal year begins in October and ends with September. As most of you are aware, the Board has been diligently pursuing cost reductions the past few years to bring our expenses in line with our revenue. Below are few items of note, some which aren't shown in the Q3 period ending in June because they took place in July and August:

 Field Day expenses came in just barely over budget after a \$50 donation from Laguna Woods ARC. Thank you, we hope you had a great time and look forward to having you join us again next year! Food expense for Field Day was \$719.74 and

generator expense was \$494.63, for a total of \$1,214.37 against a budget of \$1,200.

- We budget \$100 for the Annual Picnic and rely on leftovers from Field Day (frozen hamburgers and non-perishables). This year all costs associated with the Annual Picnic, including boat rides, were donated by Erik and Dana Wresch. Thank you for your generosity!
- After a review of our insurance policies by Mike Mahan, the Board voted to cancel one of our policies earlier in the year due to overlapping coverage. This will save us approximately \$600 per year.
- Thank you to the SOARA Saturday crowd in past years we were spending \$50 per month on coffee and donuts for SOARA Saturday. Thanks to your donations, our YTD expenses are \$68.

We will be solidly in the black this year, mainly due to the disposal of a \$900 asset, donations of \$1,190, and the fact that we've barely touched the \$1,000 budgeted annually toward Equipment & Repeaters Repair and Maintenance. I will be working on SOARA's 2018-19 Budget over the next several weeks and will submit to the Board for approval at our September meeting. In preparation I made the following proposals to the Board at our August Board meeting and both were unanimously approved:

- Since we have some projects on the table (eliminating the phone line at Trabuco being a top priority due to the escalating expense which currently comprises 20% of our annual budget) and some aged equipment that needs replacing and since we have the funds to do so the Board has approved rolling over the unused portion of the Equipment & Repeater budget into 2018-19. This is in addition to Restricted Donations of \$275 that were donated specifically for repeater repairs.
- Ticket purchases for our 2017 Holiday Party exceeded the cost of the event by \$360. The board voted to use the excess funds toward additional door prizes for the 2018 Holiday Party.

I look forward to sharing SOARA's 2018-19 budget with you as soon as it has been approved by the Board.
