President's Message, February 2019

This month, I'd like to offer a couple of, three actually, reminders of, hopefully general interest.

First, I'd like to remind all of you about the HF Radio Giveaway contest, where SOARA will award a Kenwood TS-850SAT HF radio with antenna tuner, and a \$300 gift certificate at HRO. Contestants must be SOARA members, 25 years old or younger, and complete a 250 word essay about "Why I Deserve an HF Radio" or "How I will Utilize an HF Radio" or a combination of the two. The deadline for submitting the essays is Wednesday, March 13, to "Board @soara,org. Details are in last month's Propagator, or email me: <ae6h@soara.org> and I'll gladly answer any questions and provide a copy of the full requirements.

Next, We've had a few recent occurrences of someone, seemingly driving around and accidentally dead keylng various repeaters. I say, it's most likely driving around because the signal strength varies, and we can often hear conversations, radios, and road noise. OF course. this is not only illegal (unidentified transmissions) but also annoying and often prevents others from utilizing the repeaters. This is most likely inadvertent and because of loose microphones stuffed into the seat, drink cup holder, or some other place where the PTT can accidentally be triggered. Handhelds, in similar situations, can do the same thing. The solution is to use microphone hang up clips. If you don't want to drill hole in that beautiful dashboard or console (I don't). there are a number of designs of plastic microphone hanger brackets that successfully attach with heavy duty double-stick tape. I've successfully used this method of safely securing the mic in my Ford Focus since 2013. As for handhelds, there a re a number of clip on dash or cupholder mounts available. If you or a friend has access to a 3D printer there are several mike holder designs available for free. All these are a good inexpensive alternative to the screw mounted spring metal mike clips. Another good tip and "Good amateur practice" is to set the Time Out Timer on your radio(s). Recommended is between 30 seconds and one minute. You can actually say a lot in a minute, and

this prevents an open mike from tying up the repeater for a long time.

Finally, I'd like to do a shameless plug for the OC Fire Watch Program (OCFW). Hard to think of wildfires being a threat after the heavy and frequent rains we've been experiencing, but all this rain means lots of new growth of the light flashy ladder fuels that cause wildfires to spread so quickly. All too soon these fuels will become dead and dry, raeady to ignite. The OCFW just complied their 2018 report which has some pretty impressive statistics:

Orange County Parks, and the Irvine ranch Conservancy, the two primary agencies served, combined manage over 100,000 acres of parks, wild land and open space. Since the inception of the OCFW program, volunteers have dedicated over 18,000 hours to help prevent wild fires through active public education, visible reminders, deterrence, and early detection. In 2018 alone, volunteers gave 3,333.5 hours to the program, with 12 days of Red Flag deployments, and presented 25 public education and outreach programs. Major partners in the OCFW program, are the OC Parks, the Irvine Ranch Conservancy, the Orange County Fire Authority, along with the Cities of Irvine, Newport Beach, Laguna Beach and Laguna Woods. Other cooperating agencies include the National Weather Service, South Orange Amateur Radio Association, the Orange County Sheriff's Department, Orange County RACES, Crystal Cove State Park, and the US Forest Service.

We could use a lot more Ham volunteers on the roster, because there are deployment areas where cell coverage is unreliable, and ham radio fills in the gaps. Hams, using SOARA's 447.180 repeater on Santiago Peak, in addition to reporting fires and other emergencies, help provide situational awareness to the deployed volunteers. The partyline nature of radio allows all on the net to know what is occurring at other FW posts, vs having to wait for a cellphone call from the OCFW operations center,

If you want to be and Elmer, please talk to me. The main requirement is the willingness to help fellow amateurs. I will gladly make you a special SOARA Elmer badge.





SOARA Repeater Update

Last week, the radio that provides our link to Santiago from Laguna Beach started transmitting spontaneously. We have disconnected the link radio from the controller and are investigating the cause of the key-ups.

The 224.100 machine lost receive audio recently. The cause was determined to be a fault in the RLC-3 radio interface card that it was connected to. A spare card was swapped in and the machine is back up and running.

At Santiago, our 224.640 machine is having problems again. The transmit audio becomes very low and eventually you can't hear it intermittently. It will be some time before we can make another trip up there to repair this repeater.

Everything else is working well.




