How I will Utilize an HF Radio David Tiao, KK6VQG

Whoosh! That's the sound of the future passing by, speeding too fast to get a good look at it. Ham radio technology moves slower than technology in general, but it still marches on. At the University of California, Irvine (UCI), I am president of the Amateur Ham club. While the equipment we use at UCI is up-to-date, I don't have a workable HF radio anywhere else. The equipment in our room can't be taken outside due to University Regulations. If I receive the HF radio, I will use it to promote and enrich our hobby as well as make contacts in remote locations.

With the HF radio, I would promote our hobby and club around campus by showcasing the radio in an ad-hoc setup and showing people that they can communicate around the world from anywhere. Oftentimes I am trying to recruit for our club and induct newcomers into the expanse of amateur radio, but run into a snag. Without an HF setup at our table we can't showcase the full power of radio communications to span the globe in an instant; we can't make a contact in Antarctica while talking to a potential recruit. The HF radio would increase involvement among the student body and attract more members for our club. Nonetheless, I would use the Kenwood for more than just recruitment.

I travel to remote locations every year to take pictures and search for new contacts and friends. From the Mojave Desert and Death Valley to Mt. Shasta and Trinity National Forest, I try to travel all around California to see who I can find on the air. An HF radio would be extremely useful in these kinds of locations because the radio waves bend through the ionosphere back down to the earth, enabling communication with distant contacts. For example, I am traveling to Anza-Borrego desert this month in search of wildflowers and new contacts, and to Death Valley in May. Talking to new people is always a rush, and I can't wait to see who I can find.

With the Kenwood TS850-SAT, I will encourage new members to join the fold, make new contacts and do my best to enrich our mutual hobby. I will discover new places, new people, and new ideas. Technology improves, society changes, and generation after generation gets engrossed by the same hobbies. The future marches on, and it drags us with it. With an HF radio, I can be much closer to marching in step with it.

April 15, 2019 General Meeting Joe Moell KØOV on T-Hunting

This month we are delighted to welcome Joe Moell KØOV. He is a registered professional electronic engineer and an active Amateur Radio enthusiast since age 11.

Joe has over 45 years of experience designing radio-frequency circuits and systems for broadcast, communications, and radar, ranging from near-DC through microwave frequencies. He has designed new devices for radio direction finding and has written about RDF and other topics for almost every ham radio publication in the USA.

In February 1998, he was appointed by the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) as the USA's first ARDF Coordinator, to promote international-style foxhunting and to organize Team USA for

international ARDF competitions. He also conducts the annual CQ Worldwide Foxhunting Weekend.

Joe has written hundreds of articles and columns on RDF, and as a Technical Advisor to ARRL Headquarters has authored a new chapter on RDF for The ARRL Handbook.
