# President's Message, May 2019

There a lot going on within SOARA the past month, beginning with the formation and appointment of the digital exploration committee, ()which still awaits their charge from the board, the need to relocate the Trabuco repeater from the facility it is currently in, and to a nearby location, and of course the auction this Monday night. Also, we have a board position to fill, with the resignation of our club secretary, Greg, N6PM, and we are also slightly reorganizing the VE testing function.

The digital committee will be exploring the If, What, Where, and How SOARA will enhance our digital footprint. Since we already have three D-Star repeaters, the committee may decide that the membership wants to concentrate in optimizing those machines with more training, awareness, and possibly adding functionality. Among other options, the committee may find that we can branch out into additional modes, such as Fusion (Yaesu) or DMR / Moto turbo. None of these choices will be simple, and the committee has a bit of research to do, and bring their recommendations to the SOARA Board. This will not happen quickly, but hopefully we will have a comprehensive, well thought out plan for implementation.

As for the Trabuco Repeater, it has been located at the Orange County Probation Department's youth facility known as Joplin for over 20 years. The County has decided to permanently close that facility, and all operations cease on May 24. By May 31, the facility will be completely closed and locked. This closure has necessitated that SOARA remove and relocate our repeater radios, cabinet, and associated equipment such as antennas. We have a location which may or may not be the permanent location, and this will necessitate take in the repeater off the air briefly, hopefully for less than 48 hours. We hope to accomplish this, this week.

Lastly, we are openly recruiting for a replacement secretary, and for a webmaster / IT type to take over some of the computer functions, and take a bit of the burden off Brian. If you, or someone you know would be a good fit for either of these jobs to help the club, please do not hesitate to step forward, and let me. or any of the other Board

members know, in person, by email, or on the air. I know we have a tremendous amount of talent in the club, and we could use their help right now

The Heathkit HW-101 was working when last shut down for testing. It is likely the rig needs a low side SSB crystal and the switches need cleaning. Parts are readily available and instructions and demos on youtube. Someone can pick this up for a song, and a restored unit was seen on ebay for \$300.

The other unit is for the more adventuresome restorer. It is a Yaesu FTDX 560. Check this out on Google. This rig was stored in a non- environmentally controlled garage but at this price, highest bid, it could be a lot of fun bringing it back to life.
