President's Message, July 2019

Greetings all. In this month's President's message, I'll touch on several topics briefly.

First, events this immediate past July 4th and and 5th are, for us here in Southern California, are a not so subtle reminder that "shift happens" and the need to be prepared. As Licensed amateur radio operators, we have a bit of increased incentive and responsibility to be a bit more prepared for the certainty that our area will experience similar events.

Preparedness starts at home with the usual supplies,:first aid equipment, waer, non perishable food, a means to prepare it (camp stove, etc.) blankets, sleeping bags, etc. Keeping those HT batteries charged, and even large automotive batteries available to operate that mobile vhf/uhf, and even that HF rig operating. Think about a random wire antenna, or other simple portable antennas that could easily be set up in the back yard, in case your home isn't structurally safe there are many available lists of personal survival supplies to guide you. A little thought and preparedness action can go a long way when crisis strikes. Again, I emphasize water, a gallon per person per day, for at least a week! It doesn't have to be stored bottled water. Our water heaters, swimming pools, even toilet tanks are clean water sources, and boiling and settling questionable water can help you survive.

Along similar lines, summer offers many opportunities for outdoor operating, whether it be something ambitious like summiting and a SOTA event, or just setting up portable or mobile in a campground, park, or at the beach. Doing these things, although possibly eliciting some rolling eyes or even groans from other family members, are great practice for a disaster. Volunteering to work a pubic event such as bike ride, marathon, etc. also hones our skills to operate remotely, and become more familiar with our gear.

Next, Tuesday evening will be the first official meeting of the SOARA Digital Exploration Committee. This committee is an independent group, free from SOARA Board influence, to determine the desires,

interests, and needs of the general membership, as well as determine what will enable the club to bring those desires, interests. and needs to fruition. Expect to receive a survey questionnaire by email from the committee in the near future, Please take some time to thoughtfully respond to that questionnaire, as the information gained will determine where the committee and SOARA go from there. Your input will be important.

Finally, I just want thank all who turned out to support a great field day. Although it will take several months for the ARRL to compile all the statistics from the hundreds of field day operations all over North America, I think we can safely declare SOARA's Field Day 2019 an unqualified success. Remember, Field Day was conceived as, and continues to be an emergency preparedness exercise. A special shout out to Dana, KM6LZG, our FD coordinator for pulling it all together, for great meals, and overall one of the smoothest, best coordinated FD's that I can remember for the last 20 years, or so. Thank you Dana, and thank you to everyone who participated. It was a great example of teamwork.

Robert MacHale (KE6BLR) will be expanding on his Space Communicator presentation delivered at the DX Convention in April 2017. The focus of this presentation is on making contact with the International Space Station by sending and receiving APRS text messages to and from the RS0ISS callsign. We will discuss the basics of tracking satellites in real time with Two Line Elements (TLEs).

He has developed a home brew Az/El rotator with robotics parts from ServoCity and Arduino parts from Adafruit. This project code named "R2D2M2" mounts either the Arrow II antenna or the Elk antenna. These are the two most commonly used portable antennas for 2m/70cm and satellite communications.

Robert also works with Boy Scouts achieving merit badges in Radio, Robotics, and Space Exploration. He is a leading member of Space Communicator Club providing tools for iGates sharing Satellite APRS traffic over the APRS-IS network.
