## Greetings,

My message for this month: We will feel the change change of seasons, as we move into fall. Not only do we welcome cooler fall weather, but the season change also has opportunities for more enjoyment of our hobby. The fall typically sees changes in propagation, generally improved, with more opportunities for longer distance HF contacts. Not only does the location of the fabled gray line change, based on the time of day, but moves in a way that improves earlier evening contacts to the west, bringing Hawaii, the Pacific Islands, Japan and other parts of Asia into play. We no longer have to stay up into the wee hours to work this part of the world.

Fall often brings other opportunities for all hams even if your license doesn't give you lots of HF privileges. New hams and veterans alike can benefit from many opportunities to participate in contests, and many other activities like local public service events.

For contests, just check the ARRL website, or other popular contest calendars, and you'll find hundreds of contests you might want to explore. The cooler weather and earlier darkness make predominately indoor activities more attractive for us. As we learned from Bob Grubic NC6Q, program presenter at our September meeting, contesting is a great way to learn more about your radio setup, and about operating in general.

Another great way to not only improve your operating skills, but to also give back to the community is to make the effort to join in as a communicator on special events, and of course become involved in one of the numerous public and disaster preparedness (Emcom) organizations that make extensive use of hams. The list of these organizations is extensive and they give numerous opportunities to participate. Examples include: your local city ARES or RACES. Laguna Niguel, Laguna Woods, Mission Viejo, the Tri-Cities combined ARESRACES group of Dana Point, San Clemente and San Juan Capistrano are
all examples. Groups with wider ranging coverage such as OCHEART and OC Fire Watch also have many Ham volunteer opportunities. Through the above organizations and several others, you can use and grow your ham radio skills. New hams remember, your new Technician license allows you privileges that are perfect for the local Emcom and public service groups, and special service events, which typically use UHF and VHF extensively bto provide communications.

## Swap Meets and Auctions are Back

One of the most fun I have as an electronics enthusiast and amateur radio operator is attending electronic swap meets and auctions. They are great places to pick up some cables, used ham gear, test equipment and much more.

We have two local swap meets that are up and running monthly.
The TRW Swap meet is held on the last Saturday of each month. The swap meet hours are 7:00 AM to 11:30 AM., located on the southeast corner of Aviation Blvd. and Space Park Drive (one traffic signal south of Marine Ave.) in Hawthorne, CA. More information can be had at W6TRW Swap Meet The next one will be on October 30, then November 27 and December 25. Yes, they even happen on Christmas - attendees are pretty dedicated. SOARA has a booth where excess club equipment is being sold by Heiko, AD6OI. There were about 40 vendor booths in September. My find last month were two assortments of Fair-Rite and Laird ferrites for $\$ 40.00$.

The Claremont Amateur Radio Society (CARS) Radio/Electronics Swap meet is held on the third Saturday of each month, except December. 6:00am to 11:00am, at the parking lot of Granite Creek Community Church 1580 N Claremont Blvd, Claremont, CA 91711. There are usually 15 or so vendors selling radios, components and other items. I picked up a AR-22 antenna rotor and control box rebuilt and tested for $\$ 40$. The next swap meet is November 17.


There is also the former ACP Swap Meet, used to be held on the $4^{\text {th }}$ Sunday of each month at Edinger and Grand in Santa Ana. This event has mostly faded away and there were no vendors the last two months, but I mention it just in case it re-appears.

Finally, SOARA is holding an auction at our November General Meeting. There rules will be different than at prior SOARA auctions to make the auction go more quickly and to avoid the many unsold items that plagued prior SOARA auctions. Details on auction rules and item limitations will be sent to all members by email and will be in the next Propagator.
