President's Message

It's SOARA annual elections time, and for those of you not familiar with our SOARA election process for the Constitutional Officers and Directors, a brief explanation follows.

The elections process is set forth in the SOARA Constitution and By-laws, with Section VIII of the by-laws spelling out the procedures. Elections are held annually during April, with ballots being furnished to the current active (paid up) members, by email prior to the April meeting. Voting is electronic, and there are provisions in place to insure that a member can cast their ballot only once. While not foresee-

ing any problems in this area, the Board felt that these secure provisions would eliminate any perception of the elections not maintaining integrity.

Terms of the Officers and Directors are for two years, with the Bylaws calling for electing the Constitutional Officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer) in even numbered years, and the Directors (Communications, Education, Membership, Publications, Repeater, and Technical) in odd numbered years. 2018 being an even numbered year means that we will be voting for the Constitutional Officers.

The current SOARA Board of Directors is charged with selecting and presenting their recommended slate of candidates at the March meeting, and also calling for additional nominations from the membership at that meeting. The 2018 Board recommended slate of Constitutional Officers is:

President: Ray Hutchinson, AE6H Incumbent

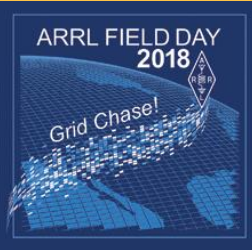
Vice President: Eric Wresch, W6INE

Treasurer's Report

I'm sure that every SOARA member has wondered at times how their dues are being spent. When I first accepted responsibility as SOARA's Treasurer in February 2016, it quickly became apparent that SOARA was spending much more than we were taking in from membership dues. If we didn't get our spending in line fast or raise our dues, we would run out of money. No one on the Board wants to raise membership dues, and I made it my primary goal to reduce expenses and get our spending in line with our current level of membership dues.

Our annual budget is based on membership dues of \$10,000 per year, roughly 200 members at \$50 each. That amount has remained fairly steady for several years. We have many lifetime, family, and student members who don't pay the full \$50, and new members replace those who choose not to renew. Despite all of the Board's hard work since I came on board, our 2017-18 budget still projected a \$1,900 loss for the year and we are still working on ways to reduce expenses.

It should come as no surprise that maintaining our repeaters is our biggest expense. Rental expense for Santiago Peak and the cost for the phone lines and DSL currently comprise 79% of our annual budget. There is no room for play in the rent cost of Santiago, but the board has been working hard to reduce phone expense. We've been able to cancel four lines so far, and a team of people are working on finding a solution for the *Trabuco* repeater, currently \$160 per month. Eliminating that phone line at Trabuco is the key to getting our budget in line. We also budget an additional \$1,000 each year for repeater repairs, but we don't always need to use all of those funds.

Field Day is our next biggest expense, budgeted at \$1,200. This is a \$100 increase over last year due to the increasing cost of renting a generator (budgeted at \$500). The SOARA Board is looking into ways that we might possibly be able to reduce the cost of renting a big generator. We also budget \$100 for our annual picnic. Insurance for equipment and liability runs a close second at \$1158 per year.

While it may seem like nickels and dimes, I sincerely thank everyone who has been donating toward donuts and coffee for SOARA Saturday. We had been spending \$50 per month, and thanks to you our expenses were cut in half last fiscal year and have been minimal this year.

The budget I submitted to the Board for Fiscal Year 2017-18 (See Page 7) doesn't reflect any cost reductions we've made so far this year. Thanks to Mike Mahan's review of our insurance policies we've been able to cancel one of the policies, saving us several hundred dollars per year. But the phone line at San Clemente increases every few months (it was less than \$100 per month just two years ago), and many other expenses continue to increase on a regular basis, so we need to remain diligent.

My thanks to the rest of the Board for working so hard with me to reduce expenses, thank you to the members who are helping to brainstorm ways to replace the San Clemente phone line. I also want to thank the Warrior Society for their generous donation toward our repeater expense. Year to date our financials are right in line with expectations, and once we get the San Clemente phone expense handled we should be in good shape.

On-the-Air Test of New FT8 "DXpedition Mode"

A second beta version of WSJT-X version 1.9.0 has been released, the WSJT development group announced this week. The "release candidate," as it's called, is designated as version 1.9.0-rc2. An initial beta release has already been field-tested by a small group of users. The WSJT development group said a primary purpose of the second beta release is to allow further field testing of the new FT8 "DXpedition Mode," designed to enable DXpeditions to make FT8 contacts at very high rates, and it is inviting the Amateur Radio community to participate in a public test run of FT8 DXpedition Mode on the evening of March 6 (North American time).

Communications:

Our year has started off well, we have already supported three events and have more planned. This month, on Saturday the 24th, we are doing the last of the Chili Winter trail run series and we would like some volunteer help. All it takes is a hand held radio and a desire to have some fun. May is our big month, we will have the Orange County Marathon on the 6th, and the Memorial Day 1/2 Marathon on the 28th. The half marathon will need about 12 volunteers and will be done almost entirely on simplex. The marathon will support the sag wagons (they bring in the people who can't quite make it) by using APRS and a local repeater to support the event.

On a more general note, please use our repeaters, especially those on Temple Hill, in Laguna Beach. When possible, move your conversation over to our lesser used repeaters on Temple Hill - that's 147.645-, 224.100- and 445.660- all with PL110.9.

If you have questions please check with myself or our repeater director Brian NJ6N.

Bouvet DXpedition Reboot

3Y0I Bouvet DXpedition Invites 3Y0Z Team to Join Forces

This week, the 3Y0I Bouvet Island DXpedition team publicly invited the members of the ill-fated 3Y0Z team to join forces as part of "rebooted preparations" for the venture, but 3Y0Z team co-leader Bob Allphin, K4UEE, told ARRL that his group has other plans. Dates for the 3Y0I DXpedition, meanwhile, remain up in the air at this point, but the team said it would announce its expected dates of operation soon.

ARRL Requests Expanded HF Privileges for Technician Licensees



ARRL has asked the FCC to expand HF privileges for Technician licensees to include limited phone privileges on 75, 40, and 15 meters, plus RTTY and digital mode privileges on 80, 40, 15, [currently limited to CW for Technicians] and 10 meters. The FCC has not yet invited public comment on the proposals, which stem from recommendations put forth by the ARRL Board of Directors' Entry-Level License Committee, which explored various initiatives and gauged member opinions in 2016 and 2017.

NTIA Targets Portion of 3.4 GHz Amateur Band for Potential Wireless Broadband Use

The National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) has identified 3450 to 3550 MHz for potential wireless broadband use. Amateur Radio has a secondary allocation of 3300 to 3500 MHz, sharing the spectrum with government radars; the popular "weak-signal" frequency is 3456.1 MHz. The NTIA oversees the use of spectrum by federal government agencies.
