He had noted what was clearly non-ham activity on the main 70 cm band simplex, 446.000. hit the road. Three others, listened at their locations, and offered support via text and simplex radio.

Brian, NJ6N from his Laguna Niguel QTH, and Tom, AE6SH form Mission Viejo, listened and did computer research, based on the hints we heard from the interloper's brief transmissions. Those hints lead us to believe that this was some sort of commercial enterprise, had employees going off on and off breaks, involved food service, and given the background noises, a children's or young adults venue.

A bit of mobile roving by Richard and myself, using some directional antenna and doppler bearings, along with the above clues and research, we were able to pinpoint the signals to a child daycare business in the Lake Forest area. Richard and I made contact with the supervisor in charge at the facility, and he showed us their newly delivered Asian handi-talkies they had just received from "Corporate," preprogrammed with frequencies.

Experience has shown that these radios come from the factory with a handful of frequencies across their intended band(s) that are used by the factory to align the radios. These frequencies are standardized within the same model of radio, and aren't deleted before the radios are shipped. There is minor mention of this in the very fine print of the limited manuals that come with the radios, but little information beyond that. Some sellers of these radios advertised that these radios as "pre-programmed and ready to use."

Cooperative T-Hunt This Monday (RACES)

Ken Tucker, WF6F, will be the fox this coming Monday, April 16th, on the monthly cooperative T-Hunt. He will hide on paved, publicly accessible property in the North Tustin/Orange foothill area east of the 55 Freeway, south of the 91 Freeway, north of the I-5 Freeway, and west of the 261 Toll Road. He will begin transmitting tones on the input (146.295 MHz) of the OCRACES 2-meter repeater immediately after the OCRACES net, which should be about 7:20 PM. Hunters will compare bearings on the 448.320 MHz repeater (141.3 Hz PL), and are encouraged to beacon their positions via APRS during the hunt. This is an enjoyable exercise in working together to quickly find potential interference.

We told the facility supervisor that this was a friendly warning that their operations were illegal, that they were operating within the amateur radio band, and that they had one week to cease using the ham frequencies or we would be reporting them to the FCC, which would likely result in fines, etc.

The point of this is three fold. First, I'd like to thank everyone involved: Richard, K6RBS, Gray WA6BJY, Brian NJ6N, and Tom, AE6H each for their contributions. Second, It highlights the cooperation we in the ham fraternity enjoy, and finally, to highlight how we must always be alert for interlopers, often well-intentioned and unaware of what they're doing.

I expect more of these incidents in the future, as the price of these inexpensive Asian made radios drops as they are offered on the market. We found the exact make and model of radio for \$17 each on eBay, and 5 packs for \$80 on Amazon. These are not little FRS bubble-pack radios either, but full-sized, 16 channel, 5 watt UHF radios with several miles of range. I'd like to encourage all to be listening, and if you're so inclined, to join in our T-hunts and hone your T-hunting skills, because this does have practical applications.

Once again thanks to all involved and we believe that this incident is being resolved to everyone's satisfaction. Great work Guys, in the spirit of amateur radio,
